- Must complete all requirements to participate in graduation ceremony.

A-G REQUIREMENTS

- A set of classes that must be completed to attend a California UC or CSU campus.
 - 2 yr Social Science, 4 yr English, 3 yr Math, 2 yr Lab Science, 2 yr World Language, 1 yr Fine Art & 1 yr Elective.
- Must earn “C-” or better in the above courses.

COLLEGE INFO

- SAT/ACT Exams in the Spring (if possible)
- SAT/ACT exams must be completed by the December* test dates of Senior Year.
- Colleges use test scores, courses completed and GPA.
- NCAA Clearinghouse (Not A-G)
 - End of Junior Year – Always Changing

** Due to COVID-19 exam scores may not be necessary*

COLLEGES & DEGREES

- Types of Colleges/Schools

- Vocational
- Community College (Junior College)
- 4 yr University
 - UC (research university) and CSU (teaching university)
- Professional (Medical, Law, etc.)

- Degrees:

- Certificates (3 months to 18 months)
- Associates (2 year degree)
- Bachelors (4 year degree)
- Masters (additional 2 years after Bachelors degree)
- Professional/PhD (varies from program to program)

- Transfer Programs: attend a Community College for 2 years (Freshman & Sophomore) then transfer to a University to complete the last 2 years (Junior and Senior).

● STEP 1

- Determine your criteria
 - ❖ Type of college
 - ❖ Size
 - ❖ Majors offered
 - ❖ Location
 - ❖ Cost
 - ❖ Admissions requirements

● STEP 2

- Do online research

● STEP 3

- Investigate colleges of interest

PAYING FOR COLLEGE

- Financial Aid (FAFSA & Cal Grant GPA)

- Financial Need
 - ❖ (EFC – Expected Family Contribution)
- Grants (Pell and Cal Grants)
 - ❖ Money given, usually because of financial need
- Scholarships
 - ❖ Money awarded for academic achievement or an outstanding talent/skill
- Work Study (FAFSA question)
 - ❖ Money earned at a part-time job on campus
- Loans
 - ❖ Money borrowed that must be repaid

- Military (GI Bill – helps pay for college)

- Apprenticeships (paid on the job training)
