1. The Progressive Era (1890 – 1917) (DUE 5/15/20)

2. America Becomes a World Power (1890 – 1918) (DUE 5/15/20)

## Directions for study guide slides for each period:

Slide 1: Define the Era. What is it about? What Started it? What Ended it? (5-6 sentences.)

**Slide 2:** Make a timeline using 10 events that define the period. Pick 1 key event from the timeline that you believe is a major turning point in American History. Explain your reasoning in 3-4 sentences max using 1 specific piece of evidence.

Note: You may do slides 1 and 2 on the same slide/page.

**Slide 3:** Give the Historical Context of each era by looking **back**, **during**, or looking **forward** 20 years (4-5 sentences). Next, how did the era maintain continuity from the previous era? How did it change after? (4-5 sentences)

**Slide 4:** Complexity of Argument/Relevant Connections: Connect the entire era or a particular part of the era to another historical time period. Remember, you can make connections (similarities) but also acknowledge the key differences. Please give a 5-6 sentence explanation.

Ex: The Revolutionary War can relate to the Civil War in that the Civil War can be considered America's  $2^{nd}$  Revolution. The Revolutionary War fought to define American ideals that the DOI promoted and were guaranteed in the Bill of Rights. The Civil War was a revolution within the country to clearly define those

American ideals that "All Men are created equal" by passing the  $13^{th}$ ,  $14^{th}$  and  $15^{th}$  Amendments. Both wars redefined what freedom meant.

IMPORTANT: I do not care about the format of slides, timelines etc. All I ask is that you clearly identify which task you are completing. There are only 4 tasks per time period. Use Textbook, Past Homework and Lectures, or any online resources.

GRADING: Each time period is worth 10 points and will be added to the Exams Category (40% of Grade). This plus your 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter grade will be your SEMESTER GRADE. 50/50 split.
